BioMedTech Horizons Program

As part of the October 2017 Reform Agreement between MTAA and the Federal Government, a provision was included for a \$30m Grants Fund to be established under the Medical Research Futures Fund (MRFF) to support Australian MedTech innovation.

The BioMedTech Horizons Program 'will be available for small to medium size enterprises (SMEs) and researchers who partner with SMEs for conducting activities that support development of new and innovative device technologies, clinical trials and associated registries, support researcher exchanges and workforce development.'

The BioMedTech Horizons Grants Program is being administered by MTPConnect and is required to align with the principles of the Medical Research Futures Fund.

A Steering Committee has been established to identify the projects that are to be funded under this program. Membership includes MTP Connect, the Department of Health, MRFF, MTAA, industry representatives, a number of independent consultants.

MTPConnect is adopting a similar process to previous grants programs that it has administered – specifically, focusing on certain clinical areas and seeking the input of key opinion leaders (clinicians and industry) to define clinical challenges relevant to those areas that then form the basis of the grants program.

The process will include the following:

- Identification of clinical challenges in orthopedics, cardiovascular medicine, trauma and emergency medicine and ophthalmology through involvement of key opinion leaders (KOLs) in these areas via a survey and roundtables to be conducted November – December 2018.
- Industry representatives will be invited to the roundtables.
- Steering Committee to review and select between 8-12 clinical challenges that will be proposed to the Minister.
- Call for projects to address the identified challenges between mid-January 2019 and end of February 2019.
