Announcing the resignation of Chief Executive, Susi Tegen, due to health reasons

On Sunday 18th September the Board was informed that Ms Susi Tegen would be stepping down from her role as Chief Executive of the Medical Technology Association of Australia (MTAA) with immediate effect due to health reasons.

The Board has accepted her decision and understands this is a difficult time for Ms Tegen but we fully support her decision to look after her own health.

The MTAA Board and Members recognise and appreciate Ms Tegen's significant contribution to our industry.

MTAA Chairman, Gavin Fox-Smith said: "We are very confident the MTAA is now in a better position because of Ms Tegen's tireless efforts, but from the MTAA Boards perspective it will be business as usual.

We have a robust governance process in place and the Board in the coming weeks will begin the process to recruit a new Chief Executive.

Andrea Kunca, Director of Policy and Access and Allison Fox, Director of Business Operations will act as co-lead of MTAA during this Chief Executive transition," Mr Fox-Smith said.

The MTAA is a stronger and more diverse industry association thanks to the efforts of Ms Tegen who has continued to grow the membership and position the MTAA as the foremost voice for the medical device industry.

We will continue to work constructively with all stakeholders to achieve evidence and fact based reform that is in the interest of patients.

The MTAA believes the expanded Prostheses List Advisory Committee and new Private Health Ministerial Advisory Committee announced by the Health Minister working with all stakeholders is the right vehicle to delivering long-term evidence based reform, as well as ensuring that Australians have access to the latest medical technologies.
